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1- INTRODUCTION

When I gave my life to Jesus, I began attending church and I really enjoyed the preaching of faith and encouragement.

But when the lesson was about Love, I thought – let’s skip this part because I don’t need this.

Little did I know that, that was the weakest area of my life and that I had a lot to learn about the enormous power that Love has.

**God “doesn’t have love”,
God IS Love.**

**“Love never fails”
because God never fails.**

“Love” is quite an extensive subject and it’s not my intention to address everything that there is to say about love. In fact not even I know everything there is about Love.

The intention of this book is to talk about Love:

As a weapon of war against Satan's attacks;
As a way to retaliate against the injustices that
people cause;

The intention of this book is also to explain that:

- Walking in Love is not an option, it's a **CONDITION** so that we can obtain victories here on earth;
- Walking in Love is not Religiosity deed that a Christian does to others. Instead, when we are good to others we also benefit from it.

This book began as a series of notes that I wrote for myself several years ago, which contain revelations of the power of God.

I often meditated on these notes and they really changed my life and brought me many victories in my personal life and in my ministry.

When reading this book I want to warn the readers that the subjects mentioned here are GOALS of behaviours that I have set for myself. However I haven't yet reached the goal.

It is a goal that I pursue, because I know that it not only brings me success, but it is something which pleases God. It's the way in which God himself lives.

2- WHAT IS WALKING IN LOVE?

When we are attacked with offenses, injustices, etc. we are facing an enemy that is not the person who is directly attacking us, but the enemy (devil) who wants to “bind” us.

In order to defeat them, we have to use LOVE as a WEAPON OF WAR.

In this chapter we are going to talk about **normal LOVE**

in times of peace,
without being under attack
without being under the pressure of offenses,
without being under the pressure of injustices, etc.

Then we will talk about Love as a WEAPON of war.

Walking in Love is a different lifestyle from what we are used to.

And it consists of doing the following things that are described below:

1- WALKING IN LOVE IS FORGIVING

The Bible tells us in *Matthew 18:23-35*, that a certain man owed the king a lot of money but the king had mercy on him and forgave him all of his debt.

When this man left the king's presence, he went to a colleague who owed him a small amount of money and, because he couldn't pay him back, he threw him into prison.

When the king heard of this, he became very angry and he handed this man over to the tormentors, and all his goods were confiscated and his entire family was sold as slaves until he paid his debt.

MATTHEW 18:32-34

32 Then his lord, after that he had called him, said unto him, O thou wicked servant, I forgave thee all that debt, because thou desiredst me:

33 Shouldest not thou also have had compassion on thy fellowservant, even as I had pity on thee?

34 And his lord was wroth, and delivered him to the tormentors, till he should pay all that was due unto him.

Jesus spoke of the danger in not forgiving.

Because whoever does not forgive as Jesus said, will be thrown into the hands of the tormentors, will become satan's prisoner.

Matthew 18:35

35 So likewise shall my heavenly Father do also unto you, if ye from your hearts forgive not every one his brother their trespasses.

Notice what Jesus said: *“So likewise shall my heavenly Father do also unto you, if ye from your hearts forgive not every one his brother their trespasses.”*

1) FORGIVENESS IS NOT AN OPTION

Forgiveness is a condition that God has for those who want to receive help from God.

When we forgive someone, we are not doing that person a favour, but we are doing ourselves a favour.

God has forgiven us of all our offenses and He has given us salvation. We have no right to decide not to forgive others.

2) FORGIVING IS A DECISION

When you have to forgive someone, you have to do it whether you want to or not.

Say to God: *“God I forgive this person who has hurt me and from now on, I will not hold anything in my heart against that person.”*

Even if you still feel hurt on the next day,

what matters is your decision made the day before, and the person is forgiven and your heart is clean.

If the other person does not want to forgive, that is their problem and no longer yours.

Many diseases are related to the lack of forgiveness.

You have to forgive your neighbour, your colleague, your boss and everybody else.

Otherwise, you are the one who's life will be bad and remain bad because God will not forgive your trespasses either.

2- WALKING in LOVE is NOT getting INVOLVED in any Quarrels, Arguments or Fights

The Bible teaches us that where there is envy and a factious Spirit, arguments, fights, quarrels, etc.

There is every evil practice.

If someone is involved in these things they have the “doors” of their lives open to the devil, who will come to steal and to cause all kinds of evil.

James 3:13-16

13 Who is wise and understanding among you? Let them show it by their good life, by deeds done in the humility that comes from wisdom.

14 But if you harbor bitter envy and selfish ambition in your hearts, do not boast about it or deny the truth.

15 Such “wisdom” does not come down from heaven but is earthly, unspiritual, demonic.

16 For where you have envy and selfish ambition, there you find disorder and every evil practice.

Notice what the bible says: *“For where you have envy and selfish ambition, there you find disorder and every evil practice.”*

2 Timothy 2:24-26

24 And the Lord's servant must not be quarrelsome but must be kind to everyone, able to teach, not resentful.

25 Opponents must be gently instructed, in the hope that God will grant them repentance leading them to a knowledge of the truth,

26 and that they will come to their senses and escape from the trap of the devil, who has taken them captive to do his will

As seen in this passage,

People involved in quarrels

Are bound by the devil's traps

And he does whatever he wants them to.

Arguments, fights and quarrels are the cause of

Many families breaking up,

Many marriages ending in divorce,

Many children who astray in bad ways,

Many underpaid employees, etc.

My advice is: to not engage in any quarrels

**and if someone provokes you,
MOVE AWAY or DO NOT RESPOND.**

An argument always needs at least two people therefore, if you do not participate there will be no argument.

3- WALKING in LOVE is NOT TO MANIPULATE, NOT POINTING FINGERS, MALICIOUS TALK

Isaiah 58:9

9 Then you will call, and the Lord will answer;
you will cry for help, and he will say: Here am I.
“If you do away with the yoke of oppression,
with the pointing finger and malicious talk.

In **Isaiah 58:9**, God says that He will only answer our prayers if we do three things:

1. Stop using the yoke, manipulating others
2. Stop pointing fingers at other people's flaws
3. Stop with malicious talk

1) STOP USING YOKE - MANIPULATION

The use of YOKE

Is to manipulate other people and use influence, money, sex, etc., to compel the other person to do what “I want them to do,” even against their will.

Even if a Christian is absolutely right,
And wants to help someone,

They can NEVER act “against the will” of that person.

God himself, who is the Almighty,
does not use His power to threaten or to force us
to do what He thinks is good for us.

God gave us “free will.”

2) STOP POINTING FINGERS

The “pointing fingers”

Is when we point out the flaws of other people, to speak ill of people’s problems in a derogatory tone, to hurt others.

Matthew 7:1-5

1 “Do not judge, or you too will be judged.

2 For in the same way you judge others, you will be judged, and with the measure you use, it will be measured to you.

3 “Why do you look at the speck of sawdust in your brother’s eye and pay no attention to the plank in your own eye?

4 How can you say to your brother, ‘Let me take the speck out of your eye,’ when all the time there is a plank in your own eye?

5 You hypocrite, first take the plank out of your own eye, and then you will see clearly to remove the speck from your brother’s eye.

Jesus said: *“why do you look at other people’s flaws and not your own?”*

3) STOP WITH MALICIOUS TALK

We shouldn’t brag about ourselves, thinking that we are “the best,” “a perfect person,” “indispensable”, etc.

ExampleS:

“- Ah, I’m the one who understands this. There’s no one better than me at this...!”

“- I’m the best musician in the church.”

“-Pastor I am the best! Without me this company will go bankrupt! Even my boss says: The day I leave the company, it will be a disaster!”

“-Ah, It’s not because he is my son, but this kid is better than the others...”

Luke 18:9

9 To some who were confident of their own righteousness and looked down on everyone else, Jesus told this parable:

To treat other people with “disdain” is a mistake and brings unpleasant consequences.

Why?

Because pride “precedes a great fall.”

**Because God “Exalts those who are Humble”
BUT He “Shames those who are Arrogant.”**

I know some Christians who say: *“So-and-so needs to be humbled...”*

And then, those same Christians take the matter into their own hands by humiliating that person, treating him with disdain, as someone who is inferior, etc.

In fact, the Bible says that each one of us must humble ourselves,

BUT it does not say that we should help our neighbour in their personal task of humbling himself.

It is not a transferable task.

True humility is

To consider others superior and to treat them with honour, regardless of the position they occupy.

In fact, whoever humbles themselves will be exalted, and whoever exalts themselves will be humbled - this is God's law.

4- WALKING in LOVE is TO COVER OTHER PEOPLE'S TRANSGRESSIONS

Proverbs 17:9

9 Whoever would foster love covers over an offense...

In **Genesis 9:20-27**, the Bible tells us that Noah got undressed in his tent when he was drunk and that one of his sons saw him and told everyone that he was naked.

When the other sons found out, they went into the tent without looking at him, with their face turned away from his nakedness, covered him up.

Proverbs 17:9

9 Whoever would foster love covers over an offense,
but whoever repeats the matter separates close friends.

Love hardly notices the mistakes of others, and that is the love of God.

Love always defends those you love, even when you think they are wrong

I can tell you that God always defends you, even when you are wrong.

That is how we should be with each other,

Defending each other and
Protecting the flaws of our beloved brothers,
Even when we see or think they are wrong.

Then yes, we will have God's protection.

1 Peter 4:8

8 And above all things have fervent love for one another, for "love will cover a multitude of sins."

5- WALKING in LOVE is SPEAKING WELL of OTHERS

Ephesians 4:29

29 Let no corrupt word proceed out of your mouth, but what is good for necessary edification, that it may impart grace to the hearers.

You should always be in agreement with God;

Look at others the same way God does;
Speak about others the same way God does.
Cover other people's transgressions,
Speak edifying words regarding other people.

6- WALKING in LOVE is DISCERNING THE BODY OF CHRIST

I Corinthians 11:28-29

28 But let a man examine himself, and so let him eat of the bread and drink of the cup.

29 For he who eats and drinks in an unworthy manner eats and drinks judgment to himself, not discerning the Lord's body.

In this Biblical passage,

Each one of us must examine himself,
And should not analyse our neighbour.

When a Christian does not accept other churches that belong to Jesus, when in fact they do, that Christian is not “discerning the body of Christ”.

The body of Christ

Is the group of all the people who have been born-again, whether they belong to one church or to another.

**Jesus is the One who saves us
And not the Church that each person attends.**

Unfortunately many times a Christian from one church does not accept a Christian from another church, based on “details” or “irrelevant doctrines.”

Whoever engages in this type of dispute and controversy is “not discerning” the body of Christ and is not accepting the other person is in fact a Christian.

This is why there are a lot of people who are ill and even though they have been praying for a long time, they have no results.

GOD wants to answer your prayers, but He will only do so when:

You stop talking evil about others;
You recognise that others who preach the Word of God also belong to Christ.

3- LOVE AS A WEAPON OF WAR

This book deals with LOVE as A WEAPON OF WAR, i.e., it teaches how to proceed when faced with an attack of injustice, an offence, etc.

Sometimes people are so evil to us and harm us in such a way that we become completely distressed, not being able to think about anything else.

When this happens, the normal reaction of people is to RETALIATE - repay evil with evil.

But this is the worst thing you can do, because whatever you sow, you will reap.

People who suffer injustices, attacks, etc.

They do not know that those who attack or harm them, are mere “objects” used by demons to destroy us.

Our fight is not against those people, who have hurt us, but against invisible but real demons.

Ephesians 6:11-12

11 Put on the whole armor of God, that you may be able to stand against the wiles of the devil.

12 For we do not wrestle against flesh and blood, but against principalities, against powers, against the rulers of the darkness of this age, against spiritual hosts of wickedness in the heavenly places.

In other words, the real enemy is not the person of flesh and blood that we see, BUT powerful demons that we don't see, who use circumstances and people to destroy us.

John 10:10

10 The thief does not come except to steal, and to kill, and to destroy. I have come that they may have life, and that they may have it more abundantly.

A person who fights against those who have harmed them, is like a bull in a bullfight, who thinks that the “red cape” is his enemy.

When an army goes to war:

They have to study WHO the enemy is.

They have to study which WEAPONS the enemy uses.

They have to study the enemy’s TACTICS (strategies).

They have to simulate its defensive tactics (to escape from bad friendships).

They have to simulate the attack – the **LOVE ATTACK.**

We are also at WAR.

At war against demons and not against people.

A Christian has TO WALK in Love in his normal life by being kind, forgiving, etc.

But when faced with an attack,

Faced with adverse circumstances,

Faced with injustice,

He has to fight using the WEAPON OF LOVE.

When faced with an attack, adverse circumstances, a Christian must:

1. Know that his fight is not against those who have harmed him. *(Ephesians 6:10)*
2. Know that nothing is by chance and that adverse circumstances are caused by the devil as Jesus said that the devil only comes to kill, to steal and to destroy. *(John 10:10)*
3. Know that he has to forgive, not in order to be very spiritual, not in order to do a favor to those who have offended him, but to DEFEAT the devil who has made use of that person to attack you.

1- OUR FIGHT IS NOT AGAINST PEOPLE

Someone who does not know who his REAL ENEMY is, will always be engaged in a pointless fight.

Ephesians 6:11-12

11 Put on the whole armor of God, that you may be able to stand against the wiles of the devil.

12 For we do not wrestle against flesh and blood, but against principalities, against powers, against the rulers of the darkness of this age, against spiritual hosts of wickedness in the heavenly places.

This reminds me of the story of the “Bull and the Bullfighter.” The Bull is stronger than the bullfighter and it goes to the arena full of strength.

However, it is TRICKED by the BULLFIGHTER.

The bullfighter waves a red “CAPE” and shouts: “*Olé, olé, olé.*” Then the bull attacks the “CAPE.”

Why does the bull attack the cape and not the bullfighter?
Because the animal is DECEIVED.
It thinks that its enemy is the cape.

But we know that the bullfighter is the one behind the cape. In turn, the bullfighter pierces some metal-tipped barbs that hurt the animal.

Then the bull becomes even more furious and it is as if the animal were saying: “*What? Is this the way you treat me?*” *So I will retaliate, I will harm you, I will attack you.*”

However, the animal still goes against the red cape.

But the animal is still deceived as it attacks the cape and not “its real enemy,” who is the bullfighter.

In Spain they tire the animal until it has no more strength and then, with a sword, the bullfighter kills the bull.

I tell this story to make an analogy:

The devil does the same to people.

People do not see demons and very often they do not believe that they exist and they even laugh at those who do (demons).

Then the demons present “RED CAPES”:

Diseases,
Family problems,
Problems with their children,
Financial problems,
Bad situations that happen suddenly
People who mistreat us
People who have really harmed us, etc.

And people do not know WHO THE ENEMY IS, will FIGHT AGAINST RED CAPES.

The devil will stick “javelins” into people until he destroys them or kills them.

The conclusion is this:

We have to know who our enemy is.

Our enemy is not the person who harms us.

Our enemy is not a relative who deceives us.

Our enemy is the devil, who uses people, relatives and circumstances.

When faced with an attack, if we fight against those who have harmed us, we will be “fighting against red capes” and the devil will laugh at us and, at the same time, he will keep on “sticking javelins into us.”

So, when faced with an ATTACK, we have to remember WHO OUR ENEMY IS.

Ephesians 6:12

12 For we do not wrestle against flesh and blood, but against principalities, against powers, against the rulers of the darkness of this age, against spiritual hosts of wickedness in the heavenly place.

In other words, the real enemy is not the person of flesh and blood that we see, BUT powerful demons that we don't see, who use circumstances and people to destroy us.

John 10:10

10 The thief does not come except to steal, and to kill, and to destroy. I have come that they may have life, and that they may have it more abundantly.

A self-employed person is constantly attacked with all sorts of problems, in order to overcome these issues, needs to understand:

- That his fight is not against his suppliers.
- That his fight is not against his employees.
- That his fight is not against the competition.
- That his fight is not against someone who has harmed him.
- His fight is against invisible but real demons, who take advantage of people and circumstances to try to kill, steal and destroy.

A Minister of God must know:

- That his fight is not against people who speak evil of him.
- That his fight is not against people who create divisions.
- That his fight is not against people who make rebellions.

2- ATTACKS DO NOT HAPPEN BY CHANCE

Nothing happens by chance:

When the circumstances in life are bad,
When strange things happen,
When we are attacked,

**We have to “know” that we are facing
an attack of demons.**

The devil can use a number of tools of warfare, to try to kill, steal and destroy:

- He uses the circumstances instigated by invisible but real demons.
- He uses “people”
- He uses “thoughts”, etc.

Once Jesus was talking to Peter and suddenly something very strange happened.

Jesus stared at Peter,

He pointing his finger towards Peter’s face

And said: *“Get behind Me, Satan! You are an offense to Me.”*

Matthew 16:23

23 But He turned and said to Peter, “Get behind Me, Satan! You are an offense to Me, for you are not mindful of the things of God, but the things of men.”

What happened here?

Was Jesus saying that Peter was satan?

Was Jesus saying that Peter was possessed by satan?

Of course not.

What happened was that Peter “was listening” to satan, and said the things that he heard from the devil.

Imagine that Jesus could see the devil hidden behind Peter, whispering into Peter’s ears.

Imagine that after Peter spoke a few seconds later. Jesus then concluded that Peter was saying the things he had just heard from the devil.

This is what often happens.

The devil comes near a person that we know,

And starts talking to their mind. Then that person does not understand where these thoughts are coming from and speaks and acts accordingly.

Sometimes those words and actions come as poisoned arrows,

To offend us
To denigrate our image,
To harm us.

Often, people who offend us do not even realize what they are doing.

They are people who do not know how to filter their “thoughts” in order to separate our own thoughts, from the thoughts that come from God or from the devil.

3- FORGIVENESS IS NOT A FAVOUR THAT WE DO FOR OTHERS

The “Lack of Forgiveness” brings terrible consequences, it paralyzes a person, it paralyzes businesses.

The “Lack of Forgiveness” is one of the devil’s best Weapons.

The devil’s strategy is to use someone to offend you and to bind you with invisible but real chains of “un-forgiveness.”

II Timothy 2:24-26

24 And a servant of the Lord must not quarrel but be gentle to all, able to teach, patient,

25 in humility correcting those who are in opposition, if God perhaps will grant them repentance, so that they may know the truth,

26 and that they may come to their senses and escape the snare of the devil, having been taken captive by him to do his will.

Notice verse 26 - “...escape from the trap of the devil...”

This is the reason why the devil uses:

People to harm you.

People to speak ill of you.

People to be hypocrites

People to OFFEND you

People to HARM you

People to MISTREAT you

People to CAUSE you GREAT PROBLEMS

The devil creates situations, hoping that you will fall into the **TRAP** of:

Being offended

Being resentful

Not forgiving

Retaliating

Repaying evil with evil

The law of sowing to reap comes into action.

In **Mark 4:26** Jesus taught us that everything in the Kingdom of God is like a farmer who sows seeds.

Whatever we sow, that we will reap.

If we sow war, that we will reap.

Therefore, in order to overcome the evil done against us, we must sow what we want to reap -

Forgiveness, love, tolerance, etc.

The law of **Matthew 18** also comes into action.

A certain man owed the king a fortune. As he did not have what to pay with, he was arrested. But he asked for mercy and the King released him.

However, this man proceeded very poorly to people who owed him a small amount.

When the King learned what had happened, he became furious, sent him to prison.

And gave him up to the **“TORTURERS.”**

Jesus said:

Matthew 18:35

35 “So My heavenly Father also will do to you if each of you, from his heart, does not forgive his brother [a]his trespasses.”

4- WHAT TO DO WHEN FACING A CRISIS?

WHAT SHOULD WE DO

When faced with a crisis?

When faced with injustice?

When faced with offences or mistreatment?

When faced with persecution, unfaithfulness, betrayal?

1st place

- Recognise that you are under an attack.
- Recognise that your enemy is never “flesh and blood - people.”
- Recognise that your enemy is the devil.
- Recognise that the devil uses stratagems.
- Do not fall into a “trap” of offences, lack of forgiveness, etc.

2nd place

- Use the right weapon that never fails – the **WEAPON OF LOVE.**
- Use love as a WEAPON OF WAR against your real enemy.
- Use the law of sowing to reap to your advantage- sow Love to reap Love.
- Use **Matthew 5:44** and you will conquer at ALL TIMES.

3rd place

- Love your enemies, those who harm you, etc.
- Say good things about them, and do not speak ill of them.
- Do well to those people.
- Pray for them and wish them well.

Matthew 5:44

But I say to you, love your enemies, bless those who curse you, do good to those who hate you, and pray for those who spitefully use you and persecute you.

Romans 12:14,19-21

14 Bless those who persecute you; bless and do not curse.

19 Beloved, do not avenge yourselves, but rather give place to wrath; for it is written, “Vengeance is Mine, I will repay,” says the Lord.

20 Therefore “If your enemy is hungry, feed him; If he is thirsty, give him a drink; For in so doing you will heap coals of fire on his head.”

21 Do not be overcome by evil, but overcome evil with good.

Notice verse 21

**Do not be overcome by evil,
but overcome evil with good.**

5- THE GENERAL

One day I was talking to a General, who specialized in “War Strategies.”

And he said: *“The Apostle probably does not know that wars in the spiritual world are similar to physical wars.”*

Among many things, he said:

1) A terrible weapon of attack is the “Surprise” element:

Attack a place that the enemy does not expect, on a day and time that the enemy does not expect.

2) Wars are not won only with weapons.

3) There is the psychological warfare that aims to:

Demoralise the enemy,
Mislead with false propaganda,
Create an atmosphere of fear and terror
Which paralyses people,
Causing them to lower their defence barriers.

4) There are also tactics of Diversion:

Diverting the enemy's attention to False Targets.
Diverting the enemy's attention to Wrong Places.
Diverting the enemy's attention to False Dates.

5) There is Guerrilla Warfare (unconventional):

This occurs when a conventional army uses common people from a village, who are trained as fighters, for quick and short missions that inflict tremendous blows on the enemy.

The guerrilla fighter

Is recruited from amongst the village people, population,
He mingles among the people,
He looks just like an ordinary citizen.
He doesn't use a uniform which identifies him - he
is "camouflaged."
He leaves the village, makes a quick attack, and returns
to the village and goes back to his normal life.

6- SOME OF SATAN'S TACTICS

What was mentioned above,
Are some santan's tactics.

1) The devil uses circumstances, causing problems:

With documents,
With accidents,
With diseases.

2) The devil creates psychological warfare:

Demotivating a person,
Causing depression and oppression.
Deceives with False ideas - *"There is no solution."*
Creates an atmosphere of fear and terror, which
paralyses people, and makes them lower their defence
barriers.

3) The devil uses people:

Using them to offend us,
Making us think that they are our enemies,
Making us fight with that person
Making us destroy one another.

4) The devil uses our best friends:

By “infiltrating” their hearts, using our family members, colleagues, friends,

To inflict a quick blow of infidelity, of betrayal, of injustice, through acts and deeds done behind our friendship.

5) The devil uses the Tactic of Diversion:

If our friend is caught, and his wickedness is discovered:

Then the devil uses the Distraction tactic, making us divert our attention to False Targets.

Making us think that the friend who deceives us is our “ENEMY.”

6) The devil creates “Traps:”

Such as an “Surprise” attack,

In a place where the person least expects.

He uses the people that we trust the most, and whom we don’t suspect of betraying us, on a day and a time that we do not expect.

A Trap has an aim which is to:

Make the person fall into an ambush.

Make the person fall into a hole, so that the satanic guerrilla – the demons can tie that person with INVISIBLE, but very real CHAINS.

The CHAINS that BIND someone are:

Lack of forgiveness.

Arguments, fights and quarrels.

Divisions.

Retaliation.

Revenge.

Doing harm to those who harm us, etc.
